

BING'S SCHOLARSHIP

The funds for this scholarship are provided by the income from a bequest made by Mrs Elsie Violet Wells.

Conditions

The scholarships are to be in the fields of: medicine, veterinary science, agriculture, psychology, psychiatry or theology. They are to be awarded to any persons without restrictions of gender, race, nationality, creed or age who, by their occupations, courses of study or experience are qualified to carry out research (at Masters level) in such fields.

The fields of research in which the scholarships will be tenable for the years 2007 – 2012 are as follows:

Value

The value of each award shall be \$2,000 per annum.

Tenure

Each award shall be tenable for one year and that year shall be the thesis year of a Masters degree.

The award shall be tenable by those undertaking full time study at a university in New Zealand.

Application

Applications must be made by 1 October in each year for awards tenable during the following year.

The application should be accompanied by:

- (a) Signed Universities New Zealand privacy form;
- (b) A certified copy of birth certificate and proof of New Zealand citizenship or permanent residency;
- (c) A certified copy of academic record;
- (d) A statement outlining the candidate's proposed research, present extracurricular activities and any other particulars that may prove useful to the selection committee.

Candidates shall nominate as referees two persons who have been requested to testify directly and confidentially to the selection committee.

Applicants enrolled at a university in New Zealand must apply through the Scholarships Officer of their university, from whom the prescribed application form may be obtained.

All other applicants should apply through the Scholarships Manager of Universities New Zealand, from whom the prescribed application form may be obtained.

Nomination and Selection

Each university shall nominate no more than one applicant per annum, and the award shall be decided by the Scholarships Committee of the Universities New Zealand at its annual meeting in December.

The selection committee's decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into following the selection meeting.
