


average citation

of government-funded research is **closed**, therefore inaccessible to most New Zealanders

of NZ university researchers would support a policy that allows for "publicly funded scholarly research and/or data to be made freely available online" (2018 Ithaka Survey)



of closed articles2 could be made free to readers by publishing with gold or hybrid access at an approximate cost of NZ\$11 million. A better solution is to make these articles openly available through repositories without any publishers
