Develop 'self-leadership' as a core capability for all our people.

Develop a 'partnering' capability and mindset.

Ensure staff readiness for the continuing digital shift focusing on a digital mindset (dexterity/capability) - understand how far we have come and how much further we need to go.



SUSTAINABLE ACCESS

Through whakawhanaungatanga and reciprocity we work with our partners to ensure sustainable access to content and collections that support learning, teaching and research in Aotearoa.

Collectively negotiate with publishers and participate in content buying consortia to benefit our sector for the best return and value to our communities.

Challenge traditional publisher agreements to provide the most appropriate and widest possible access to Aotearoa's research and truly transform (or break) current models.



OPEN SCHOLARSHIP

We champion open scholarship in our institutes and Aotearoa.

Strengthen our institutional repositories and the infrastructure that supports green open access in the universities of Aotearoa.

Advance and report on the state of open access in our universities to increase the impact of our universities' researchers.

Lead the development of an open text book movement for higher education in Aotearoa.
