# Call for Applications: New Zealand Postgraduate Students' Mobility Grant to France

### 1. Purpose

- Strengthening strategic university cooperation between France and New Zealand is a priority that will significantly enhance our capacity to deliver world-class research and to develop innovative, jointly delivered postgraduate training programmes.
- As outlined in the Memorandum of Understanding signed by France Universités and Universities New Zealand on 4 November 2024, both sectors are committed to building longterm, research-driven strategic partnerships. Facilitating the mobility of postgraduate students is a key component of this vision.
- The **2025 Mobility Grant** aims to support the travel of New Zealand postgraduate students to France. There are no restrictions regarding the nature of the mobility project; eligible activities include summer schools, short-term programs, and research internships.
- 2. Eligibility and Selection Criteria
- 2.1 Eligibility

### Applicants must:

- Be a **New Zealand citizen** or **permanent resident** (Note: Dual French-New Zealand nationals are not eligible).
- Be students undertaking research at a New Zealand university as part of their enrolment in a Masters or PhD degree in any field of study.

### 2.2 - Selection Criteria

Applications will be assessed based on:

• Academic merit.

- Relevance and added value of the proposed mobility project.
- Future career objectives and motivation for undertaking the travel to France.

#### 3. Grant Value

- The grant will support travel to **France**, including its overseas territories **New Caledonia** or **French Polynesia**.
- The French Embassy will award grants of:
  - o **NZD 5,000** for mobility to mainland France.
  - o **NZD 3,000** for mobility to New Caledonia or French Polynesia.
- Grants will be paid directly to successful applicants as soon as possible following notification of award, and no later than **30 November 2025**.

### 4. Application Process

#### 4.1 – Timeline

- Application deadline: 30 September 2025
- Mobility project must be completed by: 15 June 2026

#### 4.2 - Submission

### 4.3 – Language Requirements

• No prior knowledge of the **French language** is required to apply.

### 4.4 – Application Components

Applicants must provide the following:

### A. Applicant Profile:

- CV and academic transcript.
- Statement of future career objectives.
- Letter of support from the academic supervisor.
- Copy of passport photo page with expiry date.

### **B. Project Description:**

- Summary of the proposed mobility project and academic/research objectives.
- Statement outlining the relevance and added value of the proposed mobility project, including the motivation around the mobility.
- Tentative timeline including duration and key activities.
- Budget breakdown (travel, accommodation, insurance, visa costs), and details of co-funding, if applicable.

### **C. Expected Outcomes:**

• Description of the anticipated impact and any intentions to strengthen future academic ties with France.

- One representative of the French Embassy in New Zealand and the Cook Islands, who shall Chair the panel.
- Two representatives from **Universities New Zealand.**
